EVENT DESCRIPTIONS

Playdates — **Aug 1 & Aug 8**, 2025

These are casual, drop—in gatherings for parents and keiki (children) to visit the campus before the school year begins. They're a wonderful opportunity to meet other families, become familiar with the environment, and help ease the transition into the program. Children can explore the space while parents connect with teachers and other caregivers.

Open House — **Aug 15**, 2025

All families are invited to come to campus and bring any personal supplies or items their child may want to have on hand during the program (e.g., extra clothes, comfort items, labeled water bottles, sunscreen, etc.). It's also a chance to review important logistics with teachers, ask questions, and finalize any remaining paperwork.

First Day of Programs — Sept 2 & 3, 2025

- Sept 2 marks the first day for children enrolled in the TTH (Tuesday/Thursday) and MTW (Monday—Wednesday) programs.
- Sept 3 is the first day for the MW (Monday/Wednesday) group.

Community Events — Various Dates

Held throughout the year (Sept 12, Oct 17, Dec 5, Feb 27, etc.), these gatherings are informal and fun, designed to foster a sense of connection among families, staff, and children. Events vary in theme but typically include hikes, beach cleanups, crafts, or celebrations.

Fall Festival — Sept 22, 2025

A seasonal celebration of autumn with nature-inspired activities, games, and crafts. Families are encouraged to attend and may be asked to contribute snacks, decorations, or volunteer support.

Fall Break — Oct 6—10, 2025

No programming during this week. Families are encouraged to enjoy the season and rest.

Indigenous Peoples' Day — Oct 13, 2025

No program in observance of the day. Families are invited to reflect and honor the rich cultural contributions of Indigenous communities.

Spooky Forest Festival — Oct 31, 2025

A fun, seasonal celebration designed to highlight the mystery and magic of the forest. Children may dress in costumes, participate in nature walks, and enjoy themed activities. Not scary—just spooky in the most joyful way.

Veteran's Day — Nov 11, 2025

No program in observance of this federal holiday.

Fall Feast — **Nov 21**, 2025

A communal meal where families are invited to share dishes that are meaningful to them. It's a celebration of community and gratitude before the November break.

November Break — **Nov 26**—**28**, **2025**

No programming during the Thanksgiving holiday.

Winter Solstice Performance — Dec 19, 2025

A magical, child-centered performance marking the Winter Solstice. Children may share songs, simple dances, or stories prepared during their time in the program. Families are warmly invited.

Winter Break — Begins Dec 22, 2025

Return from Winter Break — Jan 6 & 7, 2026

Children return to campus rested and ready to begin the second half of the year.

New Year's Potluck — Jan 8, 2026

Families gather to share food and intentions for the new year. This is a joyful, community-building event that celebrates fresh starts and connection.

Martin Luther King Jr. Day — Jan 19, 2026

No program in observance of the holiday.

Hearts of the Forest — Feb 12, 2026

A gentle, forest—themed celebration of love and kindness. Children may exchange handmade tokens of appreciation and engage in heart—centered crafts. We will also take a nature hike.

Presidents' Day — Feb 26, 2026

No program in observance of the federal holiday.

Spring Celebration — Mar 13, 2026

A joyful welcoming of springtime, filled with outdoor play, music, and crafts that honor growth, renewal, and the changing season.

Spring Break – **Mar 16**–20, 2026

No programming this week.

Prince Kūhiō Day — Mar 26, 2026

No program in honor of Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole, a key figure in Hawaiian history who advocated for Native Hawaiian rights.

Earth Day Event — Apr 22, 2026

Families join in celebrating the planet through eco-friendly crafts, nature—based activities, and discussions about caring for the Earth. Children may engage in planting or environmental art.

May Day Event — May 1, 2025

A traditional Hawaiian celebration with flower leis, music, and movement. Children participate in honoring the spirit of aloha through hula and lei making/giving.

Bouquet Making — May 8, 2025

A hands-on flower-arranging activity where families will create bouquets.

End of Program Ceremony — May 21, 2025

A closing celebration recognizing the growth and experiences of the year. Children and families gather to share memories and say farewell before the summer.
